Difference between previous system & GST regime:

(a) No Cascading effect under GST- under the previous Indirect Tax System, VAT is levied on price which includes Excise Duty. This leads to double taxation. This is removed under GST, both CGST and SGST are levied on base price of 110.
(b) S.P is less under GST.

(c)Total tax paid under GST is less (22 in comparison to 29.22 under present system (13.75 + 15.47 = 29.22)).



Workshop on "How to write a Research Proposal" by Dr. Monica Bansal on 08-02-2022








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


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

Hence the new education policy is also research oriented and we people associated with education should know the right process of research and the cuts adopted for it. We should stay away from the paste formula; only then our research will prove to be meaningful for us and society. He thanked all the members of the Research Committee, IQAC Coordinator Dr. Congratulations to Bharat Bhushan and the entire technical team. Today's one day online national workshop was attended by over 200 participants and the entire event was streamed on Facebook Live in addition to Google Meet. The program was successfully conducted on Google Meet by Research Committee member Dr. Payal Singla and Facebook live stream by technical team members Madam Gurbinder Kaur, Prof. Prince Singla and Prof. Ashish Baghla.

Under the leadership of Principal Dr. Surinder Singh Thakur at Guru Nanak College, Kilianwali, a one-day national workshop was organized by the Research Committee of the college in collaboration with IQAC today through virtual medium. The main topic of this online workshop was How to write a great research proposal? To give information on this interesting and very important topic for teachers and students, Dr. Monika Bansal, Director, Panjab University Rural Center Kauni, District Sri Muktsar Sahib appeared on the online platform Google Meet. Dr. Monika, who herself has 16 years of teaching experience and has successfully completed many research projects, module development, etc., was formally introduced by the Research Committee Coordinator, Dr. Seema Jindal. Dr Seema invited the keynote speaker to speak on the online platform, citing the changing technology of research in today's time, its increasing importance and its multifaceted aspects in the new education policy and its challenges. The keynote speaker, Dr. Monica, while giving her presentation through PPT, today threw light on the importance of research and research proposal for teachers and students in the education world. Giving detailed information, he said that today it has been made mandatory by many universities to prepare research papers and research proposals for the students, especially for the students of postgraduate classes. According to him, to prepare a great research proposal, you must first know its knowledge and research skills in every aspect. For this, you must have critical thinking skills and communication skills. You should also be expert in explaining its purpose and significance to everyone. Clear title of the research proposal in at least words, what issue/problem has been made the focal point in it and why, what literature or text-material has been followed for it, which research method has been adopted, for this What is the proposed budget and how 10 to 15 references should be made at the end of the proposal and what will be the possible results of this research proposal... He discussed all these points in great depth. After that, which are the regional, national and international funding agencies for your proposed research, he also presented the details of them from his practical experience. The rules of review of literature, research, data collection and analysis and finally conclusions and suggestions play an important role in making your research proposal the best. In your research, you can also seek funding and assistance from national agencies like UGC, ICSSR, RBI, AICTE, NCERT and international agencies like UNO, WTO, Bill & Melinda Gates for major or minor projects in your research. Azim Premji Some private institutions like Universities, Tata Trusts, Welcome Trust etc. also provide funding for research. Students can also apply for funding for their research or doctorate and teachers for their fellowship/post-doctoral programmes. Grants are also made available for creating infrastructure for research, establishing international cooperation, technology development, organizing workshops or symposiums or participating in research activities at home and abroad. If you properly prepare your research proposal keeping in mind the prescribed rules, then the above agencies definitely give their approval to it. Thereafter, research committee member Dr. Khushnaseeb Kaur Surya put the questions asked by the participants in front of the keynote speaker and Dr. Monica Bansal answered them to pacify the curiosity of the participants.
