RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. Students are admitted without any discrimination based on religion, caste, creed or colour
2. Failed Students or students with Compartment from other institutions and the students from our college who have repeatedly failed can be admitted only on the special permission of the Principal and the as per the rules of Panjab University Chandigarh.
3. Students disqualified by any Board/University shall not be eligible for admission.
4. Any student who didn't appear in the University/Board Exam will be treated as gap-case and may be refused admission.
5. Migration shall not be allowed without genuine reasons.
6. The Principal is competent to refuse admission to a student on the grounds of indiscipline and misconduct.
7. Any admission can be rejected if the student is found guilty of concealing information and submitting bogus certificate.
8. In case the admission is rejected after scrutiny, fees and funds deposited with the college will not be paid back.
9. History and Culture of Punjab as a subject of study can only be opted by the students who are not domiciled in Punjab and have not studied Punjabi upto class X.
10. A student should not have any Criminal Case/Police Case pending against Him/Her.

USEFUL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

1. The application form must be filled in by the candidate in his or her own handwriting in a clear & legible manner.
2. The application form complete in all respects must be submitted to the college office as has been indicated in the Admission Notice 2023 as well as in the Prospectus on or before the last date indicated even if the result of the qualifying exam has not been declared.
3. The application form must be completed in all respects. No column should be left unfilled. If any information sought is not applicable to the candidate the word 'NA' should be entered against the column.
4. Attested copies of Board, University Certificates claiming special status etc. must be attached with the application. In case the required documents are not attached, the application is liable to be rejected as incomplete.

LATE ADMISSION

A student whose result of +2 examination conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 10th August of the year of admission may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result & his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission.

In the case of P.U. students who have already appeared in any of its examinations & the result is declared late for one reason or the other, the admission cannot be said to be a case of fresh admission. In their cases, admissions to the next class/course are allowed within 10 days, from the date of dispatch of the result without charging any late fee.

DOCUMENTS TO BE ATTACHED With The Admission Form

The following photo copies of the Certificates duly attested are essential for admission.

1. Birth Certificate (Matric Marks list)
2. Certificate of the previous classes passed.
3. Certificate of S.C./S.T./B.C./O.B.C./Minorities, Disability & Certificate of Annual Income from all sources.
4. Students coming from other Boards/Universities outside the jurisdiction of Panjab University have to furnish Eligibility Certificate. Migration required from the students who have passed 10+2 other than PSEB/HBSE/CBSE (Prior Class/Migration Certificate in Original)
5. Eight passport size photographs of candidate.
6. Character certificate from the institution last attended.
7. Aadhaar Card Number (Must for all)
8. Bank Account Number with IFSC Code of the Bank.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the Principal. The application must be countersigned by his/her parent or a responsible guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/she has cleared all college dues.

A student has to pay college fees and all other dues until his/her name is formally withdrawn. Refund of fees will not be permitted except the refundable security.

COLLEGE LEAVE RULES

Leave must be applied for in advance on the prescribed leave form available from the office.

- a) Leave upto 3 days will be granted by the Mentor and for more than 3 days by the Principal.
- b) In case a student is absent continuously for a period of 7 days, his name will be struck off from the college rolls. He will be re-admitted in the college within 10 days by the Principal on the recommendations of the Academic Committee, surety of the parents and after the payment of Rs. 110/-, there after admission can be made within a period of 20 days by paying fine of Rs. 500/
- c) The fine will be remitted only on producing the 'Medical Certificate.'

IDENTITY CARD RULES

1. On joining the college each student is issued an Identity Card bearing his/her Photograph, Name and Roll Number.
2. Students are expected to carry their Identity Cards with them to the college.
3. Books are issued from the library and students are admitted to the Reading Room and House/ Semester Examination on production of Identity Card. I-Card is also necessary for participating in cultural and social activities and for claiming Railway/Bus Concession. If it is lost, another can be got issued on the payment.

1. A candidate seeking admission to the first year of B.Com/B.A should have passed the subject of English.
2. A candidate have been placed in compartment in one subject only.
3. A candidate should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which the candidate had been placed in the compartment.
4. A candidate should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination as laid down below
 - A) B.A- A candidate should have obtained at least 35% marks in the aggregate of all subjects (including the marks obtained by him or her in the subject of compartment, Theory and Practicals taken together) taken by him or her at the +2 examination.

Guidelines for admission according to NEP-2020

- The undergraduate degree will be of 3 years and 4 years with in-between exit options on the completion of an even number of semesters, with appropriate certifications.
- There is an option of entry at various stages too but one will have to complete the degree in 7 years.
- In NEP 2020, an academic year has been divided into two semesters, each of 15 weeks.
- Each paper has been assigned certain credits like 2, 3, 4 or 6.
- A theory paper of 2 credits will mean; a class room teaching of 2 hrs/week while a practical paper of 2 credits would mean; a lab work of 4 hrs/week. Similar calculation is for other credits.
- Each students will have to earn 24 credits per semester. Those students who will exit after 2nd or 4th semester will be asked to earn 4 more credits by attending internship, apprenticeship or a training program during the summer vacations.
- The minimum number of marks required to pass each semester examination shall be 40% in external examination and 20% in Internal Assessment.
- For promotion from second to third or fourth to fifth of from sixth to seven semester the candidate shall have to earn 50% of the total credits till that semester.
- To obtain the degree of the Punjab University, the candidate shall obtain more than 50% credits from Panjab University.

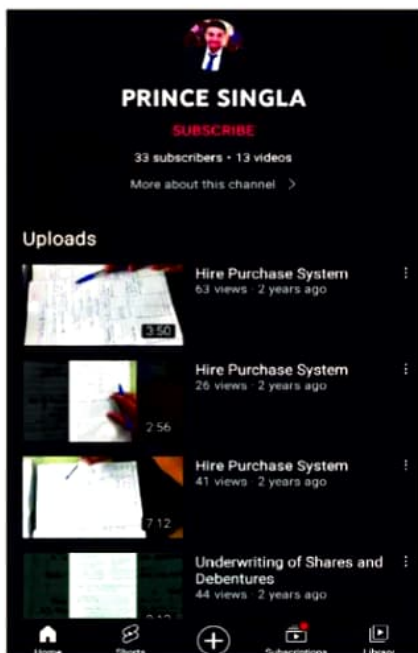

LIBRARY

This is the pride of our college. It has huge, spacious & attractive building. It has more than 22,600 books of Arts, Science and Commerce with bar-coding. Most of the activities of the library are computerized. At present we have 6 magazines and 10 journals of Hindi, Punjabi & English & 8 leading newspapers of three languages. (All the books are arranged subject wise on shelves for open browsing). The surroundings of the library are comfortable and ideal for study & there are ample reading spaces available for quiet study especially its huge-sized Reading Room.

Globalization has opened new avenues for the students. It has its challenges and opportunities. Communication and knowledge have transcended the political boundaries. However, rural colleges face a serious handicap when it comes to digital accessibility to information. Guru Nanak College, one of the oldest premier institute of the area, has introduced Electronic library (with assistance from UGC, New Delhi) from session 2013-14. Six Computer terminals have been set to provide free access to educational tools like lectures, books, journals etc. The Managing Committee and the college staff have dedicated this e-library to the rural students who, in spite of their limited means, aspire to work and achieve the success fulfilling the cherished moto, Strive, Seek and Serve, as dreamt by the founding fathers of the college. LIBRARY RULES

1. Two books to each student of U.G. & three books to student of P.G. are issued for a period of 14 days only.
2. A fine of one rupee per day per volume is charged for the books returned after the due date.
3. Reference books, text books, rare books & periodicals are not issued except for consultation in the library.
4. The students are required to possess their identity cards while inside the Library Reading Rooms. Defaulters will be asked to leave & their cases will be reported to the Principal.
5. Books issued from the Library should be kept carefully & in no case be underlined or disfigured. If a book is already damaged in any form, it should be reported to the issuing Library Attendant or the Librarian. Once the book is issued, the student will be held responsible for the damage.
6. The loss of a book should be reported to the library before the due date in the absence of which the usual fine will be charged. The borrower will be required to replace it or to pay double its price along with his next college dues if the book is not replaced.
7. The students are expected to observe silence in the Reading Room & not to disturb others in anyway.

MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT

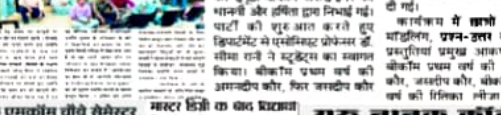

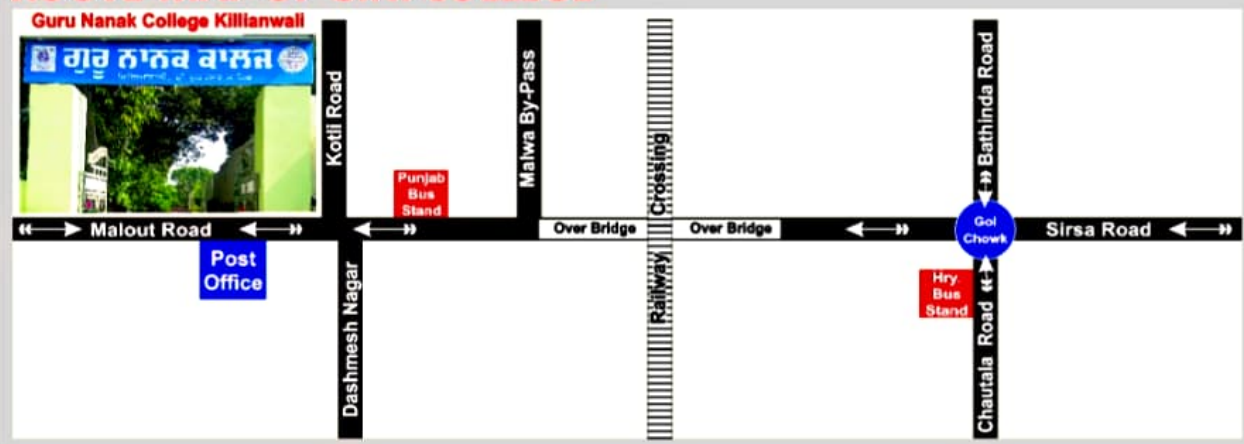
